Applicants should request their referees to forward confidential letters by the closing date direct to the same address. Submission of the application materials in response to this request will be the first of a three-stage application and selection process. Only candidates under further consideration will advance to each subsequent stage. The second stage will include an assessment of selected applicants' problem-solving ability. The third stage will include an in-person interview.

Initial review date: 15 March 2019; **Commencement of duties:** No sooner than 1 July 2019; no later than 31 December 2019

Term of appointment: Initially one year, with possible extension up to a total of three years (contingent on performance).
